## Fingerboards Mineral Sands Project Inquiry and Advisory Committee (IAC) – Bairnsdale Hearings

As foreshadowed, the IAC Hearings planned for Bairnsdale will be a hybrid between videoconference and limited in-person submitter presentations and attendance to hear from community groups and submitters.

The in-person Hearings will run from 29 June to 2 July 2021 and 12 July to 16 July 2021 in accordance with the <u>Timetable Version 7 (Tabled Document 492)</u>. The venue will be **467a Main Street**, **Bairnsdale.** Full details on the location and where to park are shown in **Attachment 1**.

The in-person portion of the Hearing is **only** for those who are presenting on their nominated day to the IAC. The Hearing venue is not open for observers to watch other parties' submissions except via the internet livestream. There will be no sit down public gallery due to Covid-19 social distancing measures and density limits.

Additional directions are attached in relation to COVID-19 arrangements.

# **Scheduled Hearings**

- 1. The Hearings will be held in Bairnsdale in accordance with the Version 7 Timetable (or an updated version).
- 2. The Panel may reschedule, postpone or cancel face to face scheduled Hearings at short notice if there is a known risk to people attending from COVID-19 or on the advice of Victorian health authorities and the Victorian State Government, or otherwise at the discretion of the IAC.
- 3. Scheduled and new Hearings may be arranged through video or phone conference where practicable.

#### **Advice from Health Authorities**

- 4. You should monitor the advice from health authorities on COVID-19 at: https://www.dhhs.vic.gov.au/coronavirus
- 5. If you are unwell or showing any symptoms of COVID-19 (even if only mild), are awaiting COVID-19 test results or have been in contact with anyone with COVID-19, then you <u>must not attend the Hearing</u>. Information on symptoms and at-risk travel and contact is available on the DHHS website above.
- 6. If you cannot attend in person for the reasons above, contact <a href="mailto:Fingerboards.IAC@delwp.vic.gov.au">Fingerboards.IAC@delwp.vic.gov.au</a> to discuss alternative arrangements.

# **Making your submission**

- 7. Submitters should plan to attend the Hearing Venue no more than 15 minutes prior to their submission time and should plan to leave immediately after the submission is made to the IAC to minimise the number of people on site.
- 8. A maximum of two people per submission will be allowed, including group submissions or an individual submitter with a support person.
- 9. Only limited attendance by represented parties (a maximum of 2 people per party) will be allowed in the Hearing room during the in-person Hearing including:
  - a) The Proponent
  - b) East Gippsland Shire Council
  - c) Mine Free Glenaladale
- 10. All tables and seating at the Hearing venue will be spaced to provide at least 1.5 metres of physical distancing.
- 11. All Hearing participants must provide and bring their own water, tissues and any required stationery such as paper and pens to the Hearing. No water, tea or coffee will be provided at the Hearing venue.
- 12. At the end of each Hearing day, represented parties will be responsible for wiping down the table with provided disinfectant wipes.
- 13. The Proponent must ensure the Hearing venue is thoroughly cleaned and disinfected by a commercial cleaning company daily.

# At the Hearing - hygiene

- 14. Kalbar Operations Pty Ltd (the Proponent) must ensure the Hearing venue is compliant with the most up to date restrictions and advice from health authorities on COVID-19 as outlined on the DHHS website: https://www.dhhs.vic.gov.au/coronavirus
- 15. The Proponent must sanitise the submitter table(s) in between each submitter using the table/s.



- 16. Upon arrival at the in-person Hearing you <u>must register using the assigned Victorian Government QR code</u> and fill in the attendance sheet with full contact details in case we need to contact you later in the event of an identified virus threat.
- 17. All participants must adhere to current face mask requirements, as outlined at <a href="https://www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au/face-masks">https://www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au/face-masks</a>. This may require you to wear a face mask at the Hearing Venue and whilst you are giving your presentation.
- 18. Pay close attention to personal hygiene at the Hearing including frequent hand-washing, avoiding physical contact with others (avoid handshakes or exchanging physical greetings), maintaining physical distancing of 1.5 metres and make use of hand sanitisers provided.

#### **Additional written submission**

- 19. The IAC provided a Direction (#57) in Document 144 for the circulation of additional written submissions or material by submitters when presenting to the IAC. This is repeated below for convenience.
  - 57. All submitters must provide any additional written submissions and any other documents (or extracts of documents) to be relied upon, to the IAC at <a href="mailto:Fingerboards.IAC@delwp.vic.gov.au">Fingerboards.IAC@delwp.vic.gov.au</a>
    <a href="mailto:one-clear business">one-clear business day prior to their nominated submission time as presented in the Hearing timetable</a>. All material must be clearly labelled (including appendices), with the submission number clearly marked (Submission numbers are included on the timetable).


All submissions will be loaded on the Engage Victoria website as soon as possible after they are received: https://engage.vic.gov.au/fingerboards-IAC.

### Car parking

The in-person Hearing will take place at **467a Main Street, Bairnsdale**. This venue has been specifically fitted out by the Proponent for the Hearing in consultation with the IAC.

Although there are car parks located in the front of the shop, these will be a designated drop off zone. Submitters are asked NOT to park at the front unless required for access by people with mobility issues. Parking for submitters attending the Hearing can be found along Radford Place or Gordon Street. Alternatively, Kalbar have arranged for submitters to have access to a carpark in a nearby paddock as indicated in the map below.

When you join the videoconference can you please use your <u>first name and last name</u> so the IAC can easily identify you. If you are representing an organisation, include the organisation name after your name - for example, Nick Wimbush, Chair IAC.

All people who join the Hearing will be placed in an attendee's room where you will be able to see the IAC members, but your camera will be defaulted to off and your microphone on mute. As directed by the IAC some parties will be moved to the presenter's room as required during the Hearing.

Should attendees need to raise something with the IAC like a question as outlined in the guidance material, you can either use the raise your hand function or click the chat function and send a message advising that you have a question. The IAC will be alerted to this and will let you know when you can speak or will respond verbally at the appropriate time.

The Zoom Hearing link will be published on the Engage Victoria website and will be accessible by the public who seek to observe the proceedings.

The IAC intends to record the Hearing (audio only). Participants are prohibited from recording any part of the Hearing in any form without permission from the IAC.
