I strongly oppose the mine as I believe it is not in the best interests of East Gippsland. I grew up in Bairnsdale and have returned to raise my children. I want them to be able to enjoy the Mitchell River and Gippsland Lakes. I am concerned about the impact that 3GL of water taken from the river will have on the eco system, the farm land that is located 500 metres from the mine site and tourism. The shire council's industry profile; https://www.eastgippsland.vic.gov.au/Business/Lets_Do_Business/Economic_and_I ndustry_Profile States that food production is a 'fundamental driver of the regional economy'. Much of this food production occurs in and around Lindenow and relies on the water from the river. I am concerned that if this mine goes ahead it will fundamentally change the East Gippsland in an irreversible way. It will have a negative impact on our economy and local jobs. It will have a negative impact on the wellbeing of local people who use the river for fitness and wellbeing.
