I **DO NOT** support the Fingerboards Mineral Sands Project for the following reasons;

- Remnant vegetation including 400 shade and habitat trees will be removed
- No guarantee of rehabilitation
- Destruction of EPBC ecosystems
- Destruction of habitat of rare and endangered species
- Destruction of creeks and waterways
- Contamination of wetlands
- Chemical use for example, flocculants are toxic
- 9 rare and endangered species occupy the site
- 2 nationally listed and 2 state listed protected species occupy the site
- Native fish, turtles and platypus depend on the health of the waterways that will be impacted
- Runoff will adversely affect the Gippsland Lakes The mine proposal is in close proximity to the Heritage Listed Mitchell River
- Negative impacts on the vast vegetable growing areas of the Mitchell River flats
- Radioactive dust and heavy metal contamination
