I was able to access the fertile river flats of the Mitchell River via one of the larger market gardens, and food bowls of the area. The Mitchell flows on to the renowned Lindenow flats above Bainsdale, a spectacular growing onea, ... along with glenaladale, supplying a considerable motortion of Victorias food. Unfortunately what I found to my dismay, is that the community of this area, farmers, growers, and the majority of the residents have been living in a high state of anxiety, pustration and anger as they face a proposal and application to build an open cut mineral sands mine on an elevated area above the river at fingerboards / glenaladale. The large and beautiful Mitchell Rlock and its tributances, not only supply the growing aren from Glenaladale to Lindenow, but supplies the RAMSAR protected wetlands. The mine proposal is on an elevated and undulating area above the Mitchell River and adjacent flats, a catchment area, and has the capacity not only to contaminate via airborne particles, but to leach toxino into aquifers, pollute gullies that run directly into the river, totally destroy a considerable area of the tree and compy enorionment, and the animals and buds that live there, the biodioanly - the biodiversity, but also the uneen minutiae of an increasingly challenged landscape. - and of course, the quality of life and livelybood for the mony farmers and residents in the commenter ...
