Comments: I object to this project going ahead for the following reasons. Where is this extra power supply coming from? We already are severely impacted by loss of power quite regularly... Now Kalbar Operations are stating they will require 9000 kilovolt-ampere (kVA) hours of power likely to be supplied from the electricity grid! They should be supplying their own power from environmentally friendly sources. Water is already in scarce supply. Farmers struggle and now we are supposed to give an annual water right of approximately 3 gigalitres to Kalbar. This is too great a cost.
